Background:

The Housing and Community Development Department (HCDD) recommends approval of a second contract amendment between the City of Houston and Access Care of Coastal Texas, Inc. (ACCT) to extend the contract to April 30, 2019 and provide \$629,500.00 in Housing Opportunities for Persons with AIDS (HOPWA) funding for a project that provides (1) tenant-based rental assistance (TBRA); (2) short-term rent, mortgage, and utilities assistance (STRMU); and (3) supportive services for persons living with HIV/AIDS.

ACCT will provide TBRA, STRMU, and supportive services to a minimum of 95 low-income households. The City of Houston is the HOPWA Program administrator for multiple areas including Austin, Brazoria, Chambers, Fort Bend, Galveston, Harris, Liberty, Montgomery, and Waller counties. Located in Galveston, ACCT provides rental subsidies to help participants at risk of becoming homeless obtain emergency and/or permanent housing assistance through its rental assistance programs with supportive services. Supportive services include case management, permanent housing placement services (PHPS), nutritional and transportation services. Housing assistance will be provided as follows: (1) TBRA for 50 households, (2) STRMU for 35 households, and (3) PHPS for 10 households of persons living with HIV/AIDS. The City of Houston provides approximately 65% of the costs for this HOPWA project.

Background:

The Housing and Community Development Department (HCDD) recommends approval of a second contract amendment to extend a contract with AIDS Foundation Houston, Inc. (AFH) to April 30, 2019 and provide up to \$1,103,716.35 in Housing Opportunities for Persons with AIDS (HOPWA) funds to finance the operation of three separate multi-unit residential facilities for persons living with HIV/AIDS.

AFH will provide permanent housing and support services across three (3) housing facilities, with a total of 75 housing units, to a minimum of 159 unduplicated low-income persons living with HIV/AIDS. Supportive services include, but are not limited to, case management, life skills training, nutritional services, and substance abuse and mental health counseling. Operating costs include property management, utilities, property insurance and other related costs. The City provides approximately 59% of the budget for this program.

The Housing and Community Development Department (HCDD) recommends approval of a second contract amendment between the City of Houston and the Association for the Advancement of Mexican Americans (AAMA) providing \$215,000.00 of federal Housing Opportunities for Persons with AIDS (HOPWA) funds to finance the operation of a HOPWA supportive services program.

AAMA will provide supportive services to approximately 65 HOPWA-eligible households that are homeless or have unstable housing conditions. Supportive services will include case management, food/nutritional services, housing placement, transportation, mental health care, HIV medical care, substance abuse counseling, education, legal assistance, and life skills training. HOPWA funds are providing 30% of the cost of this program.

Background:

The Housing and Community Development Department (HCDD) recommends approval of a second contract amendment between the City of Houston and the Coalition for the Homeless of Houston/Harris County, providing \$80,000.00 of Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG) funds for the operation and maintenance of the Homeless Management Information System (HMIS).

HMIS is a software application designed to record and store individual client data, including the types of services needed by Houston's homeless community. HMIS was developed in response to Congress' request for information on how agencies were spending appropriated federal homeless funds. All agencies receiving federal funds for homeless services are required to participate in HMIS. The City is contracting with the Coalition to comply with this requirement. ESG funds provide 11% of the funding for this project.

Background:

The Housing and Community Development Department (HCDD) recommends approval of a second contract amendment between the City of Houston and The Montrose Center (TMC) to extend the contract to April 30, 2019 and provide \$1,198,000.00 in Housing Opportunities for Persons with AIDS (HOPWA) funds for a project that provides (1) tenant-based rental assistance (TBRA); (2) short-term rent, mortgage, and utilities assistance (STRMU); and (3) supportive services for persons living with HIV/AIDS.

TMC will provide TBRA, STRMU, and supportive services to a minimum of 265 low-income households. Through its rental assistance programs, TMC provides rental subsidies and supportive services participants at risk of becoming homeless. Supportive services include permanent housing placement services (PHPS), case management, professional counseling and other supportive services. Housing assistance will be provided as follows: (1) TBRA for 55 households, (2) STRMU for 190 households, and (3) PHPS for 20 households of persons living with HIV/AIDS. The City of Houston provides approximately 22% of the costs for this HOPWA project.

Authorizing submission of the 2018 Annual Action Plan

Agenda Item#: III.a.

Background:

The Housing and Community Development Department (HCDD) requests approval to submit the 2018 Annual Action Plan to the US Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). This plan includes an application for the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG), the HOME Investment Partnerships Grant (HOME), the Housing Opportunities for Persons with AIDS Grant (HOPWA), and Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG) program funds to be received from HUD. The application estimates a total of \$39,172,745.00 in federal funds and \$251,443.00 in program income to be used to benefit income-eligible residents during the HUD Program Year (July 1, 2018 – June 30, 2019). The 2018 Annual Action Plan is the fourth Annual Action Plan of the 2015-2019 Consolidated Plan.

To date, HUD has not announced allocation amounts for the upcoming HUD Program Year. Therefore, allocation amounts listed are estimates. Once the allocation amounts are announced, the proposed dollar amounts for each budget activity will be adjusted using the percentages listed in the table below. The 2018 Annual Action Plan will not be submitted until HUD announces funding allocations.

Funding priorities include affordable home development, supportive services, infrastructure/neighborhood facilities, and economic development. The goal of the Annual Action Plan is to promote strategies that will 1) enhance quality of life, 2) expand homeownership opportunities, 3) foster community economic development, 4) preserve and expand the supply of affordable homes, 5) promote fair housing, 6) provide assistance to persons affected by HIV/AIDS, 7) reduce homelessness, and 8) revitalize communities. The format and information presented in the 2018 Annual Action Plan are based on federal guidance and requirements.

HCDD recommends that the City's estimated allocation of \$21,813,000.00 in CDBG funds and \$156,500.00 in projected program income be distributed among the following categories:

Substantial Amendment for Economic

Development Activities and New Construction Activities

Background:

The City of Houston (City), through its Housing and Community Development Department (HCDD), requests approval of substantial amendments adjusting the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) program budgets for the code enforcement, public facilities, economic development, and multifamily housing activities, and adding a new activity for single family development under the 2013, 2015, 2016 and 2017 Annual Action Plans (Plans).

In accordance with HUD's Citizen's Participation Plan, the City is required to amend components of its Consolidated Plan/Annual Action Plan for a variety of reasons, including when a reallocation of funds increases or decreases the budget of an activity by more than 25% or when an activity is added or deleted from the Plans. The proposed amendments total \$7,745,086.87 in previously unallocated CDBG funds. New construction activity was granted under a waiver provided to HCDD from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development. The waiver is in effect until June 2019, and it enables the City to undertake single-family development that is essential for residents affected by Hurricane Harvey.

Background:

The Housing and Community Development Department (HCDD) recommends City Council approval of a Land Assembly Grant Agreement between the City of Houston and the Houston Land Bank (formerly known as LARA) granting \$5,000,000.00 in TIRZ 2409 funds for the acquisition of properties associated with the Complete Communities and disaster recovery initiatives.

Previously, the Houston Land Bank (HLB) focused on acquiring tax-delinquent land parcels, often neighborhood eyesores and magnets for crime, and selling them at a reduced cost to developers of affordable homes. To date, HLB efforts have led to the acquisition of over 1,210 parcels in neighborhoods with high concentrations of abandoned and vacant lots and to the new construction of over 351 affordable homes. These new homes have returned over \$42,962,294 worth of total market value to the tax rolls.

To further support the Mayor's priorities of increased single-family home development and Complete Communities, HLB proposes expanding its scope beyond the acquisition of tax delinquent properties to include strategic acquisitions within Complete Communities and disaster-impacted areas. This appropriation will create a revolving fund restricted to the acquisition and maintenance of additional properties. In the event the funds are not used for their intended purpose, HLB will return any unused or ineligibly spent funds to the City of Houston.
